Do you own a company and want to help those less fortunate? Do you work for a company that is conscientious about giving back?

Family Promise of Lower Bucks (FPLB) is a decade-old organization focused on providing unhoused families with temporary housing while working together to navigate the system and the path to permanent residency. While most shelters separate family members by gender, we at FPLB pride ourselves on our ability to keep children with their parents, allowing them to learn and grow together.

According to Point-In-Time, homelessness increased by over 48% in Bucks County in 2022 from the previous year. With the ever-rising cost of housing and the burdensome challenge of caring for children while working low-paying jobs, FPLB helps to create positive and sustainable change in the lives of families by providing counseling and training to help them obtain and retain their housed status.

Our guest families stay with us on average a maximum of three months, which affords the opportunity for more families to enter the program. At our current site, we help up to eight families a year, with an approximate cost of \$15k per family. While the costs may seem high, the reality is that the Family Promise of Lower Bucks programming provides education and management to families in one place - something they are not able to receive elsewhere. Our program is a primary driver in reducing the impact of homelessness in the overall county with our ultimate goal, reducing the number of unhoused families to zero, making Family Promise of Lower Bucks unnecessary!

Your financial support will help us to continue to make a difference in the lives of unhoused children and families, and to ultimately eradicate homelessness in Bucks County.

### Vegetable Garden

Cadet Girl Scout, Paige Gould, a congregant of Newtown Presbyterian Church, and her Troop Leader Mom, Jennifer, contacted us after an FPLB presentation was made during a service in February to see how their troop could help our families. The plan we came up with was to install a vegetable garden. Paige took measurements and checked sun patterns to find the best placement and got to work getting plants and seeds donated. With help from her father, they constructed the beds with an enclosure to keep unwanted critters out. Paige is creating a manual for FPLB families for upkeep and is also making them a recipe book. Yum!



#### **New Fence**

Eagle Scout, Heath Martin, contacted us to see what he could do for us to earn his Service Project Award. After discussing a couple options, he decided that he wanted to fix our fence for us to make it safer for our small quests to play in the backyard. He took photos & measurements, checked with the neighbors on placement, called 8-1-1 to make sure it was safe to dig, and got the permit needed for installation. With materials and guidance donated by his uncle, Heath and a couple of his fellow scouts removed the trees and plants that were in the way and installed the new fence in no time!

## **NEW HOSPITALITY PROGRAM**

Since acquiring the Manse at Parkland Community Church to use as our Static Site, we have been able to resume our Hospitality Program, and we began sheltering families again in early April.

What is a Static Site?

A Static Site is one building that acts as the overnight "Host" facility and the "Day Center" in one location. Hosting completely in one location makes being in our program less traumatic on the families. Especially the younger children who can't understand why they have to move from one place to another everyday and every week, and why they have to wake up in the early morning to go out into the cold to be transported to the Day Center before falling back to sleep, etc. It is a more homelike setting for families to make the transition from being unhoused to becoming stable again and acquiring their own home.

Here's how our Hospitality Program has changed:

#### <u>Rotational Model</u>

- Families are transported back and forth between the Host Site and the Day Center, daily.
- All families have to follow one schedule to accommodate school/work times.
- Volunteers are asked to sign up for a specific week, 3-4 times a year.
- Cots and Pack n' plays are transported to a new congregation each week.

#### Static Site Model

- Families remain in one facility for the duration of their stay in the program.
- Families can follow their own schedules independent of the others'.
- Volunteers can sign up any day of the year to support our families.
- Since the families stay in one location during their stay, there is no need to transfer cots.
